



 - 2002-11-21
 - 2002-12-17
 - 2003-01-27
 - 2006-04-06
 - $2012-02-04 \rightarrow 2002-11-21$
- The latest is a reversion to the original proposal due to the accompanying XML/XSD not being maintained in step with the approved text.
- We maintain that the management processes should have brought the XML/XSD file into alignment with the approved textual representation.
- The term for 'poetry' was removed between the 2002-12-17 and 2003-01-27 versions.



Poetry

- Well attested genres of Latin Poetry
 - Epic
 - Lyric
 - Troupes
 - Verse Satire
- Internal constructs differentiate it from prose
 - Archaic grammatical forms
 - Archaic lexeme usage
 - Influenced by 'high register' languages (syntax & borrowings)
 - Metrical form, rhythmic pattern
 - Semantcs: use of metaphor, metonymy, synecdoche, especially to fit metrical form constraints.

Poetry has elements similar too but is not Narrative, Singing, Oratory, Ludic, or Formulaic discourse.



Conclusions

- 1. OLAC DTV doesn't represent a single set of oppositions within the same vocabulary.
- 2. Poetry is not clearly defined as a sub-category of some term in the OLAC DTV.
 - a. Poetry is different from Narrative, Ludic, Oratory, Singing, and Formulaic Discourse.
 - ь. Poetry should be added back into the vocabulary.
 - c. Poetry has its own cross-cultural and language dependent sub-categories.
- 3. The terms used in the OLAC DTV are not always clear to information professionals or linguists.
- 4. Further research should be conducted concretely describing the referential concepts invoked by the OLAC DTV terms.
 - a. This research should cite and reference to published works.
 - b. This research need not be theory dependent, but should sport clear categories and a concise test for adding new concept terms to the vocabulary.
 - c. This research should outline use assumptions and mutally exclusive categories within the vocabulary.
